MUN Med Physician Management & Leadership Program

The Physician Management & Leadership Program (PMLP) through Memorial University offers a 10-module non-credit certificate designed to build business, management, and leadership competencies among physicians.



Advanced Leadership Program - The Gardiner Center

The Advanced Leadership Program supports senior leaders, or soon-to-be senior leaders, who want to improve performance, empower teams, grow organizations, and succeed in the competitive environment in which they operate. This program is proven to build leaders who are more strategic, innovative, motivational, and valued contributors to their organizations on a broader level. The program is offered in-person, five modules over four months.



CMA Physician Leadership - The Physician Leadership Institute

The CMA's Physician Leadership Institute (PLI) offers a suite of evidence-based leadership and management courses—delivered virtually or in person—for physicians, teams, and health organizations to build skills in areas like emotional intelligence, change, systems thinking, collaboration and advocacy. Completing five PLI courses within five years grants participants a "certificate of recognition" in physician leadership
